MUNSTER BECOMES A FILTHY GRUB TO BREAK PREMIERSHIP DROUGHT.

The 2020 FCFL draft has seen Cameron Munster join his 3rd club in as many years as he hopes to end his bridesmaid status after two previously attempts at Grand Final glory.

The 25 year old Rockhampton junior has made the big dance in the first 2 FCFL seasons, with 2 different clubs, yet has fallen agonizingly short on both occasions. 2019 will be a tad more bitter, as he was named Man of the Match in a losing side, as the defending premiers Dazzlers Dingoes fell to Grubs 812 to 861.

The thought of facing a red hot Munster has scared Grubs mentor Josh into making Munster his first draft pick, and 10th overall which is astonishing considering his stats lines.

Munster has played 28 regular season matches for the Piranhas and Dingoes averaging 63.14, and averaged a mouthwatering 110.50 in his 2 finals appearances in 2019.

With Munster likely to play in the halves, many coaches chose the Fullback pick up and completely ignored Munster. 5 of the 10 coaches chose Fullbacks, with Tedesco (Noah's Ark), Tom Trbojevic (Avengers), Tuivasa-Sheck (Dingoes), Ponga (Tigers) and most surprisingly Latrell Mitchell (Piranhas) going in the first round. Considering Mitchell has moved from the Centres and will not be first choice goal kicker means he needs to be more productive to cover the loss of Damien Cook.

Of the 26 players that featured in the 2019 decider, Grubs has not only managed to hold onto 2 off his players, but poach 3 players from Dingoes with Munster, Jake Trbojevic and Viliame Kikau joining Ken Maumalo and Wade Graham in the Red and White hoops.

Joanne Bevan has scored a few handy pick ups in 2020. As well as Tom Trbojevic, she has added Blake Ferguson and Junior Paulo and Josh Papalil adding size and skill to a dangerous roster.

New comers 2Great4U have also had a solid draft round, snaring premiership winner

James Fisher-Harris, as well as the experienced Cameron Smith, Cameron Murray and livewire Ryan Papenhuyzen. And if rookie coaches are anything to go by, Eddie will be as tough as they come.

The Dragons were a very late inclusion to the 2020 season. Having finished last in 2019, retirement plans had crept in as she was asked by Gordon Ramseyto cook in one of his restaurants. Balmain Tigers needed some consistency after falling away in 2018. After missing out on retaining Tedesco, they managed to nab hot and cold Kalyn Ponga, powerhouse Andrew Fifita, livewire Luke Keary and the zip zip man Josh Addo-Carr.

Determined mastermind Darren Bevan has chosen to reinvent his tired 2019 squad. Acquisitions of Roger Tuivasa-Sheck, Kotoni Staggs, Jesse Ramien and Adam Elliott shall see if the old fella still has the wits to outsmart his newer rivals.

Jeremy Barton want on a Rampage. Damien Cook has jumped across the ditch, leaving the Piranhas after 2 seasons. The Dingoes also managed to lose Cody Walker and Clint Gutherson to the Rampage.

B!tches have flown under the radar, snaring Jack Wighton, Payne Haas, Martin Taupau and Valentine Holmes, adding some muscle and some silky skill.

Piranhas have made some extremely odd choices. Choosing a day on the drink over attending draft day, mentor Nevan Clarkson has let his Samsung do the selections and it hasn't ended well. Josh Dugan is the 2020 version of Greg Inglis, and Kieran Foran is not much better. His best bet now is to hit the Waiver Wire and snare a few outside chances to help him hit a mid table finish. Daly Cherry-Evans is a highlight, the first ever Piranhas captain is back to steady the ship.
